## <u>Year 2 Home Learning Update: 29<sup>th</sup> June 2020</u>

Hello Year 2!

I hope you are all feeling cheerful on another Monday morning and I hope you had a good week last week. It was so hot and sunny so I hope you could get outside and enjoy the weather.

Please see below for the next set of activities that you might like to try.

 Literacy: Write an alphabet list poem, with each line of the poem using an adjective and a noun that both begin with the same letter. If you can, try to choose a theme for the whole poem, such as animals, food and drink, or names of people. These don't have to be sensible poems; the adjectives you choose could be as funny or silly as you like! For example:

## Angry ants, Beautiful butterflies, Cuddly cats Etc.

To challenge yourself, I wonder if you could also include a verb or an adverb on each line, still aiming to use alliteration.

For example:

Amazing ants acting angrily, Brown bunnies bouncing brilliantly, Cuddly cats crawling curiously Etc.

Perhaps you could plan your poem first and then produce a 'polished' version, which you could decorate with illustrations.


2. Maths: This week I would like you to practise adding by partitioning, which means splitting numbers up into their tens and ones to add them more easily. Have a go at the following questions, starting with adding two two-digit numbers and then adding two three-digit numbers. The example below shows you how to lay out your work (although you don't have to use the different colours).

26 + 33	71 + 27	13 + 53	28 + 70	35 + 54
41 + 46	55 + 32	21 + 78	67 + 22	53 + 45
125 + 231	144 + 133	247 + 131	350 + 126	432 + 144

Examples:

<mark>3</mark> 2 + <b>4</b> 7	<mark>14</mark> 5 + 223
Tens: 30 + 40 = 70	Hundreds: 100 + 200 = 300
Ones: 2 + 7 = 9	Tens: $40 + 20 = 60$

3. Art: This week, your art task is inspired by Elmer, the colourful patchwork elephant. I would like you to choose any animal (you could try more than one) and have a go at colouring it in a patchwork of colours. You could either draw an outline of your animal or ask someone at home to help you print an animal outline from the internet and fill it in using all different colours. The photo of Elmer below should help give you an idea of what to aim for. If you would also like to hear an Elmer story, see if someone at home can help you find an audio version on YouTube.




- 4. **PSHE:** Last week the weather was so hot! When it is very hot and sunny, we need to look after ourselves by doing things like wearing sun cream, drinking plenty of water, wearing a sun hat, sitting in the shade and so on. Can you create a poster including lots of top tips for staying safe in the sun? Don't forget to make it bright, bold and eye-catching by using colour and adding pictures.
- 5. Spelling: This week for your spellings, I would like you to practise words that use either -dge or ge to make a 'j' sound at the end. Remember, when the word has a short vowel sound it uses the dge ending and when it has a long vowel sound it ends in -ge. Practise the ten words below and try writing them in sentences. I wonder how many of the words you could include in one whole sentence?

bridge, badge, fudge, hedge, sledge, nudge, change, page, rage, huge

If you are finding these too tricky, try practising 10 words of your choice from the lists in your books.

6. Reading Comprehension: Read the text below and have a go at answering the questions in your home learning book.



## What is the title of the text?

Who is the text all about?

What two things does Lara like to do at the beach?

What adjective is used to describe the water?

What adjective is used to describe the sand?

What shape did Lara dig to make the island for her sandcastle?

Why did Lara collect shells and pebbles?

What did Lara do with the feather she found?

What did Lara fill the moat with? (You could find out exactly what a real moat is here!)

How do you think Lara felt when her sandcastle was finished? Why?

Can you design your own sandcastle?
