Topics Overview English - This term we will focus largely on narrative writing linked to traditional stories and fairy tales. This will provide opportunities for creative writing such as retelling known stories; planning and writing alternative versions of traditional tales; exploring story language patterns; characterisation through role play; and performing and telling stories through drama. We will continue to teach daily phonics to support reading and spelling, and maintain a focus on grammar, punctuation & vocabulary within sessions. Maths - Topics this term will include work on the four operations and tackling a range of calculations with missing numbers; learning about fractions and measures, including telling the time and measuring length and mass; and the concept of direction and movement, such as clockwise and anticlockwise turns, as well as using and applying positional language. Science - This term, our topic areas will include: what different animal groups eat and comparing the conditions and habitats in which different animals and plants can survive; the properties of materials; weather patterns in the four seasons; basic components in electrical circuits; and forces and friction, and the effects of rolling objects on different slopes. R.E - This term we will be exploring the question: How should we care for others and the world and why does it matter?' We will focus on Methodism and the children will consider how Methodist values at the heart of our school affect the way we treat others and our world. P.E - PE lessons will continue to take place on Mondays (afternoon with Mr Warner) and Wednesdays (morning with Mrs Fulton). This term the children will continue with hockey as a focus during outdoor sessions and key steps followed by gym on the large apparatus during their indoor sessions. PSHE - This term, sessions will be based around the question 'What helps us to stay safe?' which explores ideas such as recognising risks and hazards in our everyday lives; keeping safe in different environments and around different people; understanding risks involved with household products and medicines; and what to do if you feel unsafe or worried in any given situation. Computing - This term, the children will continue to use the Chromebooks to work towards creating a digital fact page. They will learn basic word processing skills, such as typing in fixed textboxes; changing font types and sizes; searching and inserting images; and presenting information in a word document. Art - This term in art, we will look at the work of the famous artist Van Gogh, with a particular focus on his painting 'Starry Night'. The children will find out about the technique Van Gogh used in this painting and will try to use similar techniques to imitate his style in their own work. History/Geography - Our topic is 'Kings and Queens', which looks at the life of Henry VIII in the past and explores simple comparisons with the role of Elizabeth II. We will find out about the features of a castle and the children will use historical sources for finding out about the past. There will be many opportunities for creative writing in history, including writing in role. Our school trip to Leeds Castle towards the end of term will consolidate and enhance our learning from this topic. Music - This term we will continue our work on playing the glockenspiel. Building on how well the children did last term, they will learn a number of other tunes, which the children will perform and record in class, as well as having a go at making up some tunes of their own. Home Learning Class Targets Home learning tasks will continue to follow the same structure For this term, I would like the children as before: to continue to focus on developing the Spellings - 10 spellings will be sent home on a Thursday following areas: to learn for a mini-test on a Tuesday.

- Reading please encourage your child to read everyday (at least 10/15mins). Reading books will continue to be changed on Tuesdays and Fridays. Please write in the children's record books to let us know how reading is going at home.
- Maths a maths task will be set on Maths Shed on a Thursday to be completed by Tuesday.
- Optional Research Task there is always the option to complete research/extra work on any aspect of the curriculum. This can be shared with me in class.
