

Home Learning

Consolidating skills learned in school at home is really important. We try not to overburden the children with too much homework as we know how hard they work in school every day!

Spellings

Each week the children will be given spellings on a **Thursday** that need to be practised and learnt for a test the following **Tuesday**. Spellings that the children learn will be based upon learning in class as well as from the Y3 and Y4 spelling expectations. They are asked to practise each word a number of times using a variety of spelling techniques they have been taught in class. This makes up a significant part of their home learning and I do expect that the children make time to practise and learn their spellings each week.

Times Table Tasks

Alongside spellings, the children will be set an additional, shorter task that will be related to learning their multiplication tables and corresponding division facts. These will be based on each pupil's individual need following work in school on multiplication and division facts and through a website/app called 'MathShed' that will be familiar with from last year. The children have log-ins for this in their reading record book. Once they have completed the set assignment, they are then able to practise other times tables. A good place to start is 2, 5 and 10 times tables which they learnt in Year 2. In Year Three, we review these, then begin learning the 3, 4, 6, 8 and 11 times tables. Some of the children were using this website regularly at home last year and it has made a real difference to their speed and accuracy of recall of number facts.

Readina

Regular reading should still be taking place at home. The children can read a combination of their school reading books as well as their own books from home, the class book corner or the library. Please encourage daily reading of 15 minutes, which should be recorded in their home school record book. Reading books will be changed on a **Monday** and a **Friday**.

Additional (optional) Learning

Any additional reading (or listening to) of Roald Dahl's books would be fantastic. There are so many good ones to choose from and there really is nothing better than snuggling up with a great book. My personal favourites are The Witches and The BFG.

These tasks are all linked to our History topic on the Romans. They are optional and do not need to be completed but will broaden their understanding of the life and times of Romans in Britain.

- Times Tables with Roman Numerals -Choose a times table and write it out using Roman Numerals
- Toga Tangle- The Romans wore togas. See if you can make a toga and take a photo of you wearing it! Write some instructions for how you made the toga.
- Roman Buildings- Find out about a Roman building, then make a model of it
- Roman Baking- Make some Roman Honey Cakes or any other Roman food. Write the recipe/take a photo/bring the food into school.
- Roman Gods and Goddesses- Draw a picture of a Roman God or Goddess. Add information to the picture. What were they God of? Did they have special powers?
- Interview with a Roman Soldier- Write a list of 10 questions you would like to ask a Roman soldier who has come to Britain.
